Secretary's Message

A Busy November meeting saw us welcome 11 visitors who were keen to learn about the history of the world famous Beth Chatto Gardens. David Ward who has worked alongside Beth since 1983 gave us a fascinating insight into the development of the gardens which were initially created in 1960 by Andrew and Beth. She is now 92 and frail but still keeps an eye on David and his team on a daily basis! Her husband was a great plant scholar and there is an archive page based on his travels on the website www.bethchattogardens.co.uk.

Beth brought her artistry in Flower Arranging to the planting of the gardens. It is still evident today in the use of the Triangle Principle used in Japanese floral art. The Gardens and the Nursery have grown up together. Propagation is at the heart of the business.

Beth won 10 consecutive Chelsea Gold Medals from 1977. After the gales of 1987 she decided to concentrate on developing a 2 acre woodland garden in order to replace the devastated wild area on the boundary. Today it is a beautiful addition to the water gardens.

A visit to New Zealand with Christopher Lloyd in 1991 inspired Beth to create a Gravel garden in the old car park. We saw a wonderful image of various hosepipe snakes wending their way around the muddy site! These areas are today filled with a glorious display throughout the year.

Recently an Education Trust has been set up at the Gardens so that future generations can benefit from this inspiring place.

Beth has written several books on each of the gardens she has created on the site which would make excellent Christmas gifts if your appetite has been wetted. Check out the website.

I look forward to seeing a great number of you at the Golf Club on Friday 27th November for our Christmas Dinner. There will also be the traditional raffle, so if you are attending and have any seasonal contributions, they will gratefully received and add to the fun of the night. Ray will be back to join us, after his holiday.
